Sir/Madam,

- To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Ayurvedya Prasarak Mandal's Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Near Sion Railway Station, Sion-East, Mumbai- 400022, Maharashtra Inspection was conducted on 03.04.2025 and 04.04.2025 via Hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process Annual visitation for issuance of Extended permission with intake capacity of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course and 33 seats in 06 PG Courses in the subjects namely: (i) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta - 06 seats, (ii) Rasa Shastra & Bhaishya Kalpana- 06 seats, (iii) Dravyaguna Vigyana - 03 seats, (iv) Prasuti Tantra & Stri Roga- 06 seats, (v) Kayachikitsa- 06 seats, (vi) Panchkarma- 06 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.
- The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations thereunder and as per the Visitor Observation following shortcomings/defects have been observed:-

1. Teaching Staff:-

a) Availability of total teaching staff for UG (BAMS) Course as per the part 1 submitted by the college is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{28}{30} \times 100\% = 93.4\%$ (Excluding Excess)

b) Shortcomings are as below :-

2. Hospital staffs:-

a) Availability of hospital staff is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{79}{80} \times 100\% = 98.75\%$.

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- 3) The assessment report was duly placed in the 127th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 20.06.2025 and Board concluded that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulation but fulfilling the criteria for issuance of extended permission as per. Hence, the Board decided to issue extended permission with intake capacity of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course and 33 seats in 06 PG Courses in the subjects namely : - (i) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta - 06 seats, (ii) Rasa Shastra & Bhaishjya Kalpana- 06 seats, (iii) Dravyaguna Vigyana - 03 seats, (iv) Prasuti Tantra & Stri Roga- 06 seats, (v) Kayachikitsa- 06 seats, (vi) Panchkarma- 06 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.

"DECISION"

- 4) Therefore, Extended permission is hereby granted to Ayurvediya Prasarak Mandal's Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Near Sion Railway Station, Mumbai, Maharashtra Dist. - Mumbai- 400022, Maharashtra with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course in accordance with Regulation 54 (2) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 and 33 seats in 06 PG Courses in the subjects namely : - (i) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta - 06 seats, (ii) Rasa Shastra & Bhaishjya Kalpana- 06 seats, (iii) Dravyaguna Vigyana - 03 seats, (iv) Prasuti Tantra & Stri Roga- 06 seats, (v) Kayachikitsa- 06 seats, (vi) Panchkarma- 06 seats in accordance with regulation 15(5) of MESAR PG 2024 as per the Policy letter dated 20.01.2025 and for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcomings and following requirements shall be fulfilled:-
- I. Minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 60 seats and 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 33 seats in 6 PG Courses shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
- 5) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 6) Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
- 7) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 8) The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college as per Regulation 55 (2) of MESAR 2024 and the compliance report shall be submitted before 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the process of issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-
- i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
- ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
- iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
- iv) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024
- v) The shortcoming mentioned in para no.2
- 9) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
